

**Resolution of the
Tuolumne County Transportation Council**
Adopting the 2018 Regional Transportation Improvement Program

- Whereas,** every two years, the Tuolumne County Transportation Council (TCTC) is responsible for preparing the Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP), which programs transportation projects for the Tuolumne County Region; and
- Whereas,** the RTIP is submitted to the California Transportation Commission (CTC) for adoption into the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP); and
- Whereas,** the CTC adopts a Fund Estimate for each STIP that includes anticipated Federal and State funding that should be available for that five-year cycle; and
- Whereas,** the CTC Fund Estimate for the 2018 STIP cycle, which covers the five-year period including Fiscal Years 2018/19 through 2023/24, includes \$5.347 million in new funding for Tuolumne County; and
- Whereas,** a total of \$1,781,000 in un-programmed funds remains available from the 2016 RTIP/STIP; and
- Whereas,** Recognize the Jamestown 5 Lane Highway Widening Project for possible future use of 2018 RTIP/STIP carryover funds.
- Whereas,** \$174,000 of new funding is available for Planning, Programming and Monitoring and TCTC desires to carry over previously programmed Planning, Programming and Monitoring (PPM) funding from the 2016 RTIP/STIP; and
- Whereas,** 2018 RTIPs from regions are due to the CTC by December 15, 2017.

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Tuolumne County Transportation Council hereby adopts the 2018 RTIP, attached hereto as Attachment A, to program funds as follows:

- 1) *Carry over funding from the 2016 STIP; and*
- 2) *Increase the Mono Way Operational and Safety Project by \$2.20 million in funding to cover increased costs to the scope of the project.*
- 3) *Delay right of way and construction funding for the Mono Way Operational and Safety Project.*
- 4) *Program \$174,000 to Planning, Programming and Monitoring in FY 19/20 – 22/23*
- 5) *Program and additional \$1.190 million to the Peaceful Oaks Interchange for renewing permits and construction costs escalation.*

Be it further resolved that the Tuolumne County Transportation Council hereby requests the CTC program Tuolumne County's 2018 Regional Transportation Improvement Program into the 2018 STIP.
