**Resolution of the
Tuolumne County Transportation Council**

To reallocate RSTP Exchange Funds from the Campo Seco Rd. Railroad Crossing Improvement Project to
Tuolumne County to fund their Bridge Preventative Maintenance Plan

- Whereas,** the Federal Transportation Act provides Federal Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) funds to the Tuolumne County Transportation Council for transportation purposes; and,
- Whereas,** pursuant to Section 182.6(g) of the Streets and Highways Code, the Tuolumne County Transportation Council annually exchanges its apportionment of Federal Regional Surface Transportation Program funds for non-Federal State Highway Account funds; and,
- Whereas,** In September 12,2018 \$121,000 was allocated to the Sierra Northern Railroad for the Campo Seco Rd Railroad Crossing Improvement Project that will consist of removing the existing track structure and installing concrete crossing panels, at a cost of \$121,000; and
- Whereas,** It has been determined that the project is not qualified for RSTP Exchange funding.
- Whereas,** The County has a project that is qualified and is requesting to reallocate those funds to their Bridge Preventative Maintenance Plan and the County will complete the Campo Seco Rd. Railroad Crossing Project with Local funds from their Capital Program.
- Whereas,** this project is eligible for Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) Exchange funds; and

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Tuolumne County Transportation Council does hereby reallocate \$121,000 in RSTP Exchange Fund Reserves to the County's Community Resource Agency to supplement the required match on their Bridge Preventative Maintenance program, and the County's Community Resource Agency in turn will complete the Campo Seco Rd. Railroad Crossing Improvement Project using local funds from their Capital Program.
