Peter Anthony Young 1953-2011

Peter was a transport enthusiast from an early age, being interested in all aspects of transport, especially railways and buses. In 1967 he was one of the six schoolboys who had the idea of building their own narrow gauge railway, which was to become the West Lancashire Light Railway. He continued to be involved for several years before leaving to move out of the area to pursue his career in the aviation industry.

In 1992, on the occasion of the West Lanc's 25th anniversary, he rejoined, and became the Publicity Officer and then Honorary Treasurer, a post he held for several years until ill health led to his resignation in early 2010. While we knew that he was fighting a courageous battle against cancer, he continued to visit the Railway; his death came suddenly and took us by surprise.

Peter was very involved in many projects at the Railway, especially the restoration of the 'Joffre' locomotive. He demonstrated exceptional skill and patience in designing and applying lining out to *Jonathan* and *Irish Mail*. He died just a few days before the new boiler for the 'Joffre' arrived on site; he would love to have seen it, and how we wish that he could have lived long enough to undertake the lining out on the finished loco.

Peter was a kind, thoughtful, and considerate companion with a plentiful supply of common sense and a ready sense of humour. He will be constantly remembered, at least until *Irish Mail* has to be repainted, and will be greatly missed by his friends at Hesketh Bank.
